Does the Austrian solar industry need continuity in the financing of solar plants?

The Austrian solar industry needs continuity in the financing of solar plants. The Austrian Ministry for Climate Protection is making another 20 million euros available for the construction of private and commercial solar plants. This is urgently needed to bridge the gap until the start of funding under the Renewable Energy Sources Act.

Will Austria get a solar rebate?

From pv magazine Germany The Austrian PV industry has been patient, but help has finally come. The financing and regulatory framework for solar rebates under the Renewable Energy Sources Expansion Act (EAG) has been enacted, with the 2022 edition of the program scheduled to start on April 21.

How will Austria support solar deployment in 2021?

The new provisions will provide significant support for solar deployment in Austria. "The first agreement between the governing parties on how the energy transition in the electricity sector can be steered with state funds was already in place with the EAG in the summer of 2021.

Applications for solar plants of up to 10 kWp with or without an energy storage system will be accepted until May 19 with the total subsidy budget for this category set at EUR 40 million. The call for solar plants from 10 kWp to 1 MWp with or without storage ends on June 2.

The Austrian Federal Ministry for Climate Protection, Environment, Energy, Mobility, Innovation and Technology (BMK) has allocated EUR135 million for solar rebates in 2024. Austrian agency OeMAG is distributing the incentives under the nation's EAG legislation.

Under the scheme, Austria will support electricity produced from wind, solar, hydro, biomass and biogas by providing a top-up premium, which cannot exceed the difference between the electricity market price and the average production cost for each renewable technology.

The Austrian government has decided to introduce a "Made in Europe" bonus for PV projects above 35 kW in size with solar modules that are manufactured in Europe. "The government decision strengthens the creation of jobs and supports the energy transition," said Vice Chancellor Werner Kogler, Climate Protection Minister
