Is India the world's third-largest producer of solar power in 2023?

Source: The India's remarkable ascent as the world's third-largest producer of solar power in 2023 underscores a significant shift towards renewable energy sources in the global energy landscape. India surpassed Japan in solar power production in 2023, generating 113 billion units (BU) compared to Japan's 110 BU.

How much solar energy is installed in India?

With installed capacity rising from just over 21,000 MW in 2018 to more than 70,000 MW in November 2023, India has made unprecedented progress in the field of solar energy installation. Meanwhile, as per the Ministry of New & Renewable Energy's (MNRE) latest data, India's installed solar capacity is 82,637.86 (as of April 30, 2024).

How much solar energy does India generate in 2023?

Ember's report highlights India's remarkable growth in solar generation, propelling it past Japan from a ninth ranking in 2015. Solar energy contributed 5.5% to global production in 2023, with India alone generating 5.8% of its electricity from solar sources.

Is India's solar energy capacity growing?

India Today's Data Intelligence Unit analysed the data and found that between 2013 and 2022, there was significant growth in India's solar energy capacity. Starting from 1.60 GW in 2013, the country's maximum net generating capacity steadily rose, reaching 63.15 GW by 2022.

Will solar power be a key role in India's future energy system?

Global solar generation in 2023 was more than six times larger than in 2015, while in India it was 17 times higher. India's share of solar generation increased from 0.5 per cent of India's electricity in 2015 to 5.8 per cent in 2023. Pathways to decarbonising electricity show that solar will play a central role in the future energy system.

Which state has the most solar power in India?

Karnataka secured the third spot with 9.5 GW, while Tamil Nadu and Maharashtra held significant solar power capacities with 7.5 GW and 5.7 GW, respectively. Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, and Haryana also made notable contributions to the solar power sector.

Rajasthan has the highest solar power generation potential of any state in India. As of December 2022, Rajasthan had installed roughly 16,060 MW of solar energy capacity, surpassing Karnataka as the leading state for ...
