Should the UK reduce subsidies for solar panels?

The first is the overarching aim of policy; the latter is just one of the ways of reaching it. The decision by the UK government to reduce the subsidies it provides to those installing solar panels helps to clarify an important distinction. As such, it is a step which should be encouraged.

Will subsidies for small scale solar panels be cut?

Subsidies for small scale solar electricity panels on homes are to be cut, the government has announced, although by less than expected. The subsidies will be cut by 64%, although this is less than the previous proposal of an 87% reduction. The cuts have been softened following a storm of criticism.

What has the government changed about solar energy subsidies?

The government has now changed some of the terms, such as lowering the level of energy efficiency required to qualify for subsidies and a reduced rate for multiple installations - which takes into account the lower costs of large-scale projects. Mr Barker also said that future subsidies were to be pegged to the falling cost of solar technology.

Why do solar panels need a subsidy?

In order to protect an industry in its infancy, a subsidy is provided so that companies manufacturing solar panels can reach the necessary economies of scale, lowering the cost at which the energy is provided. And this is what has happened over the past three years.

Are solar subsidies at an unsustainably high level?

The government says that solar subsidies are at an unsustainably high level. Climate change minister Greg Barker set out the government's new plans on Thursday, and that includes the possibility of further cuts in solar subsidies. "We are proposing a more predictable and transparent scheme as the costs of technologies fall," he said.

Do subsidies affect people's willingness to install solar panels?

Analysis of data from the past 15 years shows that subsidies do have a significant impact on people's willingness to install solar panels. Introduced when the Labour Party was last in power in 2010, the Feed-in Tariff (FIT) scheme aimed to encourage the uptake of solar by paying homeowners for the electricity they generated.
